Secondary school students

Those who will have passed will either be admitted into universities or other middle-level colleges. The other students still in secondary school will be moving on to the next levels respectively. In this category, we expect many of them to come to the Northern Magic Fund for help. It is instructive to note that last year, we received many applications

from this category of students, most of which we were unable to assist. This year, we can not expect anything less. Those who missed out on the selection because of poor grades may have strived to better their grades.

Primary school students

We have quite a number of final year students who did their exams last month and will be looking forward to joining secondary school next year if they pass the exams. We expect to get many desperate cases of needy students from this group. Most of them, unable to raise fees to enable them to go to secondary schools, would end up dropping out altogether.

Mutawali Saniti, alias, Vinani - the only student in boarding primary school, being sponsored by one of you - will start his holiday tomorrow. All primary schools close tomorrow for the December/Christmas holidays and re-open in January next year.

We have started giving out application forms to needy students – those that did their standard eight exams this year and those in secondary school. From last year's experience, this year's numbers are sure to increase. Last year we received 657 applications.

The Calgary South Rotary Club, through Mr. Greg Martin, is considering sponsoring another project after the last successful one at Mtondia Primary School. The Wild Rose Foundation is also considering the same for next year.
