

In addition to the 30 sponsored students who completed their high school education this month, two of our donors who had sponsored students through their post-secondary studies were happy to share that their students are now college graduates. Faith Rukaria recently graduated as a Hospital Laboratory Technician and Elias Karisa completed his studies at the International Teaching and Training Centre in Nairobi. Elias has since secured a position in a private school in his region teaching grades 7 and 8 math and science. His sponsor tells us that he had passed his national exam, ranking second out of 350 candidates. To celebrate, his mother had cooked him a special meal—green bananas and chicken—and his sister had given him a t-shirt with "Bravo" written on it. Our student sponsors are so proud.

One of our former students, Andrew Kadzoya, received a motorbike from his school for completing his national exams with an A. The motorbike was an incentive the school had come up with as a reward to motivate students to work hard. In an article in their local newspaper, it was mentioned that Andrew had been the beneficiary of a scholarship through the Northern Magic Fund. He has since been offered a scholarship from an international organization for his university fees.
