It is because of your thoughtful support that we are able to share heartwarming and hopeful stories of our work in Kenya.

Over the years, we have had the pleasure of working with many wonderful people in Kilifi, Kenya who have helped to make the Northern Magic Fund the success it is today in this impoverished corner of our world. We would like to introduce you to one of these special people, Christine Kahindi.

Mrs. Kahindi, as she is known to her students, is the principal at Katana Ngala Secondary School. She is a tireless advocate for students who performed well in primary school but simply have no means to attend high school. She seeks these students out, inviting them to join her school, sometimes personally paying for their uniform when they do not even have the means for that. She tells them about the Northern Magic Fund and has them send an application form to us.

She was, in fact, the person who referred one of our very first students to us back in 2002. This exceptionally bright and desperately poor young man was George Ouma who today is a successful medical doctor, now married with two children. George tells us that long before introducing him to the Northern Magic Fund, "out of her kindness and special love for needy students, Mrs. Kahindi would personally supplement the little I could afford to pay on a weekly basis. She is my heroine!"

We were delighted to learn that Mrs. Kahindi was recently awarded 2017 Principal of the Year. This honour is given in recognition of outstanding leadership. She humbly attributes the award to her relationship with the Northern Magic Fund. She tells

us that the sponsored students have better grades as they are able to attend classes regularly and concentrate on their studies without fear of being sent home for lack of fees. The higher grades reflect well on her school's performance under her leadership.

"I have no words to say what the Northern Magic Fund has meant for the students and for myself. Surely, when a poor needy child has someone to pay for his/her fees, all his/her world has turned to be alive. This child will now face a bright future which has meaning. He/she will know that if they pass their exams well, they will be able to go to university and get a degree. In turn, they will get a good job to assist not only their immediate family but also their extended family members. The home and village will know a difference. There will be development in the homestead.

For me personally, it has been a big blessing seeing poor and needy children go through their school and passing so well. It has also assisted me in my promotions. And now, I can retire a very happy woman knowing how many children I have

assisted through the Fund who have become people with well paid jobs. Even this year, my best performing students are those sponsored by the Northern Magic Fund. I expect them to do very well. God bless your organization."

It is with sadness that we

let you know of the passing of Hamisi earlier this year.

Hamisi was one of the boys the Stuemer family first met on the beach in Kilifi in 2000. The boys

invited the Stuemers to their village where they talked at length about what could be done to improve life in Kilifi. The Stuemers set Hamisi up in a jewelry business, making and selling shark-tooth necklaces to the Northern Magic Fund as well as to tourists on the beach. Hamisi was just 32 years old when he succumbed to undiagnosed Hepititis B, leaving a wife and 3 young childen. RIP dear friend.

Come Join Us in Kenya

Would you like to follow in the footsteps of the Stuemer family in Kenya and tour the place that left such a deep imprint on their hearts? Now you can! We are planning an excursion to Kilifi and other parts of Kenya for donors and friends in 2018. The trip is a collaboration between a Northern Magic Fund supporter and a sponsored student, Sammy Kahindi, who graduated university with a Bachelor's Degree in Tourism Management.

This will be a custom guided tour and will include time in Kilifi, seeing the sites, meeting some sponsored students and graduates and possibly carrying out a volunteer project. There will be time for the beaches and a safari to some of the famous game parks of Kenya, as well as a city tour of Nairobi. The excursion will take place in the Summer or Fall of 2018. It will be a 10-14 day visit and Sammy can assist with arrangements if you wish to continue your travels after the tour.

The estimated cost for the full two-week trip is \$2,400—\$3,200 per person and will include all travel and accommodations in Kenya, entrance to game parks, guiding fees and some meals (does not include airfare to/from Kenya). Pre-trip support will be offered to help you prepare.
