During this festive season, we would like to extend a warm thank you to all our caring donors for your continued support. It is because of your thoughtful support that we are able to share heartwarming and hopeful stories of our work in Kilifi, Kenya.

Your generous donations enabled us to provide a secondary school education to 112 students in 2018, evenly divided between boys and girls. Each school year, we require our students to reapply and regualify for sponsorship. After reviewing the applications received for this school year, we welcomed back 63 students in Forms 2, 3 and 4 and greeted 49 new students who were thrilled to learn that their dream of a secondary school education was going to be realized. We wish all of them great success in their studies.

Over the years, we have had the pleasure of working with many wonderful donors who have enjoyed a rewarding relationship with a sponsor student. We would like to share one of those personal stories with you.

Our donor wrote "Mary Anne and I became interested in sponsoring a high school student in Kenya and remembered the Stuemer family's round-the-world voyage and their reports on the great need for this kind of support. In 2007, we began our sponsorship of 14-year-old Evelyn Madzo Kittu. We genuinely enjoyed our relationship with Evelyn, maintaining a scrapbook of photos and letters received from her over the

years. While our initial intent had been to sponsor her through high school only, we chose to continue our support as she pursued a university degree, earning her Bachelor of Education in 2015. Evelyn now teaches at a school in northern Kenya, paying it forward as she shares her knowledge and wisdom with another generation of students. We are so proud!

We are very happy to have had the opportunity to support Evelyn's education and to get to know her as a person. It has been a rewarding pleasure to work with the Northern Magic Fund on this

eleven-year-journey .. one that continues for us today and into the future."

He noted that "during her practice as a general practitioner, she discovered her passion was to deal with drug addiction and mental illness and my duty was to encourage and support her. I have done just that! Though hectic, I am happy that she is back chasing after her dream."

He is waiting for his official acceptance letter from Stellenbosch University in South Africa where he will be doing a four-year Masters program in Radiation Oncology, a program not available at a university in Kenya. He looks forward to starting this next adventure in the new year.

In the meantime, George is covering all the costs for his siblings' university studies. His sister, Phenny, earned a Bachelor degree in Nutrition and Dietetics and just completed her one-year internship this month. Kingsley, his younger brother, did well in Form 4 and joined university this Fall taking a program in Building Construction Technology at Masinde Muliro University. George is also helping with the high school fees for two nephews and two nieces. How's that for Paying it Forward?

George concluded his recent correspondence with a lovely note: "I am humbled. Without the Northern Magic Fund, I would not be writing such an email. I don't know how life would be today. It's emotional to imagine how lucky I have been in life, how lucky I was to have met Northern Magic. Life has never been the same but has been getting better every day, not only for me but for many more in my family. Forever grateful. George."
