During this holiday season, we would like to extend a very warm thank you to all our donors for your continued support. It is only with your generosity that we are able to share heartwarming stories of our work in Kenya.

Herbert Stuemer visited Kenya this past summer and wrote "This is probably the most rewarding trip I have made to Kilifi since we started. Thank you all for making this happen."

In previous visits to Kilifi, Herbert had done video interviews with our high school students. He tells us that one of the highlights of this visit was an added opportunity to meet with, and interview, a group of former students. some who had travelled several hours just so they could tell him what having an education had meant to them and how much they had appreciated our support.

Herbert said that there were many occasions when he could not hide his tears as these students recounted their stories of humble home lives. meagre food (in some cases going several days without a meal), loss of parents and lack of hope.

"I was so impressed with our graduates. Today they are teachers, clinical officers, engineers and pilots, all trying to help their communities and paying it forward by ensuring

from their education as well."

Herbert enjoyed his visits to the high schools and meeting the 140 students we had sponsored this past year. He noted that "Although a lot of equipment like computers are still rare, it seems that our funding has helped the schools quite a bit. Katana Ngala Secondary School, which many of our students

attend, was the only school I visited that offered a computer program with, as I recall, seven computers for the whole school."

Herbert also had an opportunity to meet several students who had applied to our Fund for financial assistance with

their post-secondary studies. We are pleased to have been able to offer two new university scholarships. In September, Katana Avrily Neema started her Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Amani Katana Charo started his Computer Science program. We wish them all the best with their studies.

As part of the application process, our students are

other family members benefit asked to let us know of their accomplishments but also their challenges. One of the most common challenges mentioned is being unable to study after dark. Electricity is rare in this impoverished area and there is little money for kerosene for lamps. We had researched solar lights and agreed to provide a light to each of the new students entering their first year of high school. Herbert personally delivered the solar lights during his visit. We are anxious to see if the addition of light to the humble homes of our students will result in improved grades.

Herbert also visited George Ouma, our medical doctor, who is returning to school this month for a Master's program in Oncology. When asked why he chose to do that, his answer surprised Herbert. He explained that he sees many aids patients and women with cervical cancer and that there are no specialists available for these patients. He wanted to do something about that.

## The Magic Continues

There is another special young man whom we would like to introduce to you. Morris Mwangome was a past beneficiary of a Northern Magic Fund high school scholarship. He had been passionate about pursuing a degree in medicine and surgery since he was in primary school. Even then, he understood the challenges his country faced. One of those challenges was a shortage of doctors. Another was poverty and he knew that it was through education that he could break the cycle of poverty and provide solutions to other disadvantaged youth like him. He completed high school studies with excellent grades and after working for a few years, was offered a partial scholarship to Med School .. in Russia! Can you imagine leaving your home, your friends and family, living in a country far away and taking your medical school studies in a foreign language? Morris is doing very well and is, in fact, in his 5th year of a 7 year program. His scholarship

pays his tuition fees however nothing else. He had appealed to us to continue our support for additional expenses (food, lodging, local transportation, books, medical supplies, etc). We were happy to do so. Although his training is abroad, Morris looks forward to returning to Kenya to start his medical practice.

He wrote: I had to beat all odds to become who I wanted to be. It was a tough journey. I had lost my dad a long time ago, my Mom was illiterate and my elder sister had dropped out of school. I had to help my Mom selling fried fish at the market so I could stay in school. I thank God after the primary school national exams, I emerged top pupil in our school. The light dimmed when I was supposed to start high school but because of lack of fees, could not. This is when the Northern Magic Fund came to my rescue. Through the fund's unfailing support, I excelled in secondary school and was the top student after my national exams with an A-. I now qualified to pursue a degree in medicine and even received an admission letter to the University of Nairobi but could not make it. The fees were simply too high. I was left with no other option but to stay at home, look for work and join later.

After two years at home, working at every opportunity, I heard from a friend that the Russian Federation, through the Kenyan government, was offering partial scholarships to bright and needy students. Five slots were being offered for medicine and

surgery countrywide. I applied for the scholarship and on the 28th of October, 2014, I left Kenya for Russia and saw my dream coming true!

My studies here are conducted in Russian. The first year was a full course of Russian language training with only some basics in medicine and surgery. Different from most European countries, foreign students here are not allowed to work at all and this made my situation worse as I had no other means of generating a single coin for my upkeep. I am so grateful for your endless support which has made life easier for me as I can now focus on my studies.

I always remember a quote by Diane Stuemer, "To the world you may be one person but to one person you may be the world." The Northern Magic Fund has been the world to many disadvantaged people like me and I'm going to work hard to keep the magic alive.
